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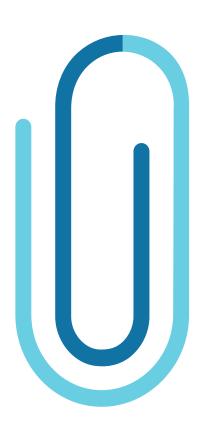

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Challenges in Engaging and Assessing (Large) Groups of Students

So many students... and so little time...

- Students want (intermediate) feedback on their work
 Think of (intermediate) deliverables such as essays, reports, designs, products
 Am I on the right track? What did I do wrong and what did I do right? What should I have done different?
- Students want feedback on their performance
 Think of contribution, initiative, attitude. Did I do enough? Am I contributing is a positive way?
- Students want to be assessed in an acceptable and transparent way and have some influence on this process

Think of: How will I be graded? How will they know who did what? How will I know if I meet the criteria?

- Students need to learn that feedback is useful otherwise no effect on learning outcomes Why is feedback useful? How do I give constructive feedback?
- Lecturers must assess students individually in a transparent (accreditable) way Who did what? Why is this essay better than that essay?
- Lecturers want to give students feedback and accurately assess their work Points for improvement, distinguish between good and bad work



Different types of use of Peers in Education

Excludes Peer Instruction and Peer Learning

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Peer Feedback

Feedback by peers on each other's work or product after completion of work

Peer Evaluation

The evaluation by peers **in the same team** (i.e., fellow
team members) with regards
to the work carried out in
the team assignment.

Peer Review

Students reviewing each other's written work with an aim for a student to improve their work based on the reviews

4

Peer Assessment

Students grading each other's work using a defined marking scheme

- No grade
- No revision
- Feedback for future use

- No grade
- 360° feedback
- For improvement during/future collaboration
- No grade
- Feedback to be responded to in revision
- Grade given
- Students assess each other
